## **Executive Director's Letter'**

#### **Dear CMWI Community,**



As we move through another season of change, we are reminded of the unique challenges we face, both as individuals and as a community. The past year has been one of uncertainty—financial pressures, shifting political landscapes, and rising global tensions. Here in Manitoba, and across North America, these challenges have rippled through our communities, affecting the most vulnerable, particularly immigrant and refugee families still navigating new beginnings within systems deeply rooted in colonial and neo-imperial violence.

At CMWI Family Resource Centre, we remain steadfast in our mission to provide support, resources, and a sense of belonging to those who need it most. Through culturally informed programs, gender-based violence support, financial literacy education, and family well-being initiatives, our work is vital in building a stronger, more resilient community. However, these essential programs are increasingly at risk due to shifting funding landscapes and a growing demand for services that often exceed our available resources.

Canada's immigration policies are increasingly disconnected from the realities faced by immigrant and newcomer communities already here—many of whom arrived with little choice. As the government presses forward with its immigration agenda, those who are already part of the fabric of this country—the backbone of our economy—are being left behind






# **Executive Director's Letter**

registrants and 150 attendees, it was a full house, highlighting the enthusiasm and support for such a pivotal event.











## MUSLIM WOMEN COURAGE & LEADERSHIP IN MB

Special thanks to the volunteers who worked tirelessly to transport, unpack and set up these homes, turning empty spaces into warm, welcoming environments filled with comfort and care.






#### CMWI PROGRAMS & SERVICES TRACK SHEET
